

So far as I am aware, my son, William Howard Marsh, was sentenced to 15 months imprisonment for spreading the English news and disrespect to the German Forces.

I have no idea of the name of the Court which sentenced him, except that I believe it was somewhere in Queen's Avenue, St. Helier.

I do not know when he left Jersey, nor am I able to say he was ill-treated.

I received one letter from my son during his imprisonment, from Naumburg-on-Saale, saying that he was alright.

It was not to my knowledge that he received no Red Cross parcels or letters, but I agree that the only way I heard of his death was through the Jersey "Evening Post".
